As a result of the impact of the global pandemic caused by COVID-19 and the associated lockdown and travel restrictions, the Conference will not be held in Melbourne in 2020. Although disappointed that ARSC2020 has not gone ahead as planned, organisers are excited to announce that the Melbourne conference is set to take place on 28-30 September 2021. Good news for NZ - the ARSC conference series will then return to the regularly scheduled annual conferences, with the next conference due to take place in Christchurch, New Zealand in 2022.</p> <p>A programme framework is available and registrations are open for this conference.</p>
